

ANNUAL REPORT WORLD MEDICAL RELIEF, INC.

2018

World Medical Relief, Inc., established in 1953, is a private not-for-profit organization. The agency operates exclusively for charitable purposes, helping the poor, sick, and elderly on a local, national, and international basis. Its mission has been--and will continue to be--to turn the excess and waste of our society into the miracles of mercy by collecting and distributing medical supplies, medicines, and recycled medical equipment for the betterment of mankind. The mission is accomplished through a variety of programs, services, and volunteer opportunities.

In 2018, World Medical Relief officially opened the Marion and Sheldon Davis Pacemaker Reconditioning Center with a well-attended reception. Later on in the year, more rooms were added to facilitate the large number of volunteers that come to sort the incoming pacemakers.

The Center was made possible by a generous gift from Sheldon & Marion Davis in addition to other grants and private donations. Project My Heart Your Heart, in partnership with World Medical Relief, developed the innovative pacemaker reuse project to make refurbished lifesaving equipment available to low-income patients in need in underdeveloped countries.

Each year, over one million people around the world die due to a life-threatening slow heart rhythm and the lack of resources to get a pacemaker or an implantable defibrillator (ICD). Under the leadership of Kim Eagle MD, Director of the University of Michigan's Samuel and Jean Frankel Cardiovascular Center and Thomas Crawford MD, cardiac electro physiologist at Michigan Medicine Cardiology, all aspects of pacemaker reuse were scientifically researched and approved by the FDA for export and use outside of the United States. World Medical Relief now houses the Sheldon & Marion Davis Pacemaker Center, the world's only pacemaker reconditioning center where thousands of devices arrive from across the country and are refurbished for future reuse.

"Through our national partnership with Implant Recycling, we have already received nearly 30,000 pacemakers from around the country," commented Dr. Kim Eagle, founder of Project My Heart Your Heart. "Thanks to the work of Dr. Crawford, we have developed an international partnership with the Pan African Cardiac Society that trains African pacemaker implanters in South Africa who then go home to their native countries and perform these procedures – potentially saving countless lives!"

Project My Heart Your Heart, initially under the project lead of Timir Baman, MD, was developed after more than nine years of working closely with infectious disease experts, legal experts, ethical experts, health systems, engineers, pacemaker manufacturers, funeral homes and crematories.

Key project partners include World Medical Relief, Dr. Kim Eagle, University of Michigan Frankel Cardiovascular Center, Dr. Thomas Crawford University of Michigan Frankel Cardiovascular Center, Implant Recycling (Sterling Heights, MI), NEScientific (Waterbury, CT), and Michigan Clinical Outcomes Research and Reporting Program (MCORRP) at the University of Michigan.

Charity Navigator awarded World Medical Relief again with a 4-star rating. This is the highest rating possible and speaks to the efficiency and financial accountability and transparency of World Medical Relief. Less than 1% of the program expenses are spent on management and fundraising.

The demand for blankets for the local homeless shelters and other community organizations that collaborate with World Medical Relief to distribute the blankets to those who need them was high. A record number – over 17,000 blankets – were distributed.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS

The International Missions and Shipment Program distributes medicine, medical and surgical equipment, and medical supplies to people living in developing nations. In 2018, the program shipped 70 forty-foot containers to many countries including (but not limited to) Senegal, Philippines, Israel, Lebanon, Uganda, Nigeria, Yemen, Malawi, Tanzania, Jordan, Sudan, Haiti, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Kenya, Iraq and Dominican Republic. Eleven mission teams were given medical supplies and the value of the shipments was \$30,842,895.

The weight of the donated items was just shy of 1,000,000 pounds. It is to be noted that these items were donated to World Medical Relief and would more than likely end up in landfill had they not come to us.

LOCAL PROGRAMS

The Affordable Prescription Program, which was started in 1966 as a senior prescription program, is available to persons 18 and older in Michigan who have a low-income and are uninsured or underinsured. World Medical Relief's licensed pharmacy fills prescriptions and then either mails them or the clients pick them up for a flat fee of \$8.30 per prescription. The program is especially helpful to those who need to be on certain medications for the long term like blood pressure and cholesterol medicines. In 2018, 8,292 prescriptions were filled with a total value of \$1,909,638.

Durable Medical Equipment is available at a small handling fee for persons without means to pay full price for items such as a hospital bed, wheelchair, shower chair, walker, commode, transfer bench. All are expensive items which are usually needed following an emergency i.e. fall, accident, etc. A referral is required from a licensed physician, nurse or social worker. Last year 290 pieces of durable medical equipment were distributed serving 222 people with a value of \$23,271.

The local shipping program provides basic medical supplies which can be obtained with a prescription for a small fee. Such items as dressing supplies, ace bandages, disposable wipes, gloves are available. World Medical Relief also offers a variety of ostomy supplies and liquid nutrition.

This program also distributes twin and baby blankets to shelters and agencies assisting families as well as personal hygiene kits offering warmth and personal care to those in need. Funds are solicited from the public, corporations and foundations for the purchase of blankets and the items for the hygiene kits which consist of a bath towel, wash cloth, small shampoo, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, and bar of soap.

Other local services include the availability of adult briefs, pull-ups, and bed pads at discounted prices. 182 people were served. The value of the supplies is \$20,979.

The local shipping program served 22,622 people in 2018 and was valued \$197,302.
